Item 1B – The agenda was reviewed; no amendments were made.

Item 2 – Chairman Pro-Tem Taylor asked if there were any changes to the proposed February 16, 2017 minutes. Hearing no comments, he called for a motion to approve. Bart May moved to approve the February 16, 2017 minutes. Jeff Lavey seconded the motion. Chairman Pro-Tem Taylor called for discussion. Hearing none, he called for the vote. The motion passed unanimously.

Item 3 - Chairman Pro-Tem Taylor introduced Lieutenant Governor, Brad Little, who will be the Master of Ceremonies and present the medals to the recipients, on behalf of the Governor.

Chairman Pro-Tem Taylor reviewed the process of how people are nominated and chosen to receive the Medal of Honor. The Medal of Honor is the most prestigious law enforcement honor the state can bestow, and the commission takes this responsibility very seriously. Chairman Pro-Tem Taylor then reviewed some of the qualifications for receiving the Medal of Honor. He went on to say that there are four recipients receiving the Medal of Honor for 2017, the three law enforcement officers are being awarded their medals today and the firefighter recipient will be awarded his medal at the Fallen Firefighters Memorial Ceremony in September.

Item 4 - Chairman Pro-Tem Taylor introduced the 2017 Law Enforcement Medal of Honor recipients: Chief Deputy Michael Barclay and Detective Sergeant Kyle Moore, both of the Elmore County Sheriff's Office. He then introduced the family members jointly accepting the posthumous award on behalf of Patrol Sergeant Greg Moore, of the Coeur d'Alene Police Department – Fred Moore (Sgt. Moore's father) and Dillon Moore (Sgt. Moore's son).

Item 4A – Chairman Pro-Tem Taylor reviewed the logistics of the ceremony for the recipients, how the medals will be presented and where the seating is.

Item 5 - Chairman Pro-Tem Taylor called for a motion to adjourn. Dennis Doan moved to adjourn. Tim Miller seconded the motion. Chairman Pro-Tem Taylor called for the vote. The motion passed unanimously.
